A Phoenix native who spent much of his career in California, Raper founded a talent agency there that specialized in bookings for soap opera stars.

The business evolved, and when Raper moved back to Arizona in the mid-1980s, he concentrated on celebrity bookings for special event producers.

Now, after more than 25 years in the business, Raper operates the Vegas Celebrity Booking Service.

Raper says he doesn't have that much face-to-face contact with his clients, but adds, "I have their home phone numbers."

His regular customers include Verne Troyer, the "Mini-Me" of Austin Powers fame; Lou Ferrigno, "The Hulk"; and Steve Wilkos, the bald-headed bouncer on the Jerry Springer Show.

Other clients include World Wrestling Federation personalities, such as "Rhyno," a.k.a. Terrence Gerin; Mick Foley, "The Commissioner"; and Mark Calloway, the "Undertaker."

Other personalities range from February 2002 *Playboy* centerfold Anka Romenski to talk show host and scuffle-starter Jerry Springer.

Besides being a broker in talent, Raper has plenty of his own.

He is a well-respected dance instructor.
